- **BOS:** Balance of State, all counties but Marion
- **CoC:** Continuum of Care
- **CHIP:** Coalition for Homeless Intervention and Prevention (Marion County CoC)
- **IHCDA:** Indiana Housing and Community Development Authority
- **PIT:** Point in Time (Count)
- **HIC:** Housing Inventory Count
- **Community Services Division:** CE, ESG, HOPWA, CoC, HMIS lead, Collaborative Applicant for Balance of State

HOUSING INVENTORY CHART – PARTNER WITH PIT

- HUD Requirement: Housing Inventory Count (HIC) is due on the same date as the PIT – April 30th. IHCD completes.
- The HIC covers these type of programs: ES, TH, SH, PH (PSH, RR, VASH).
- This count collects information for each agency: # beds, #units, special population, etc.. Between the HIC and PIT it provides HUD the information of our capacity level for each type of program. Provides information to us – what do we need in certain areas.
- We will send out a by region HIC following this webinar.

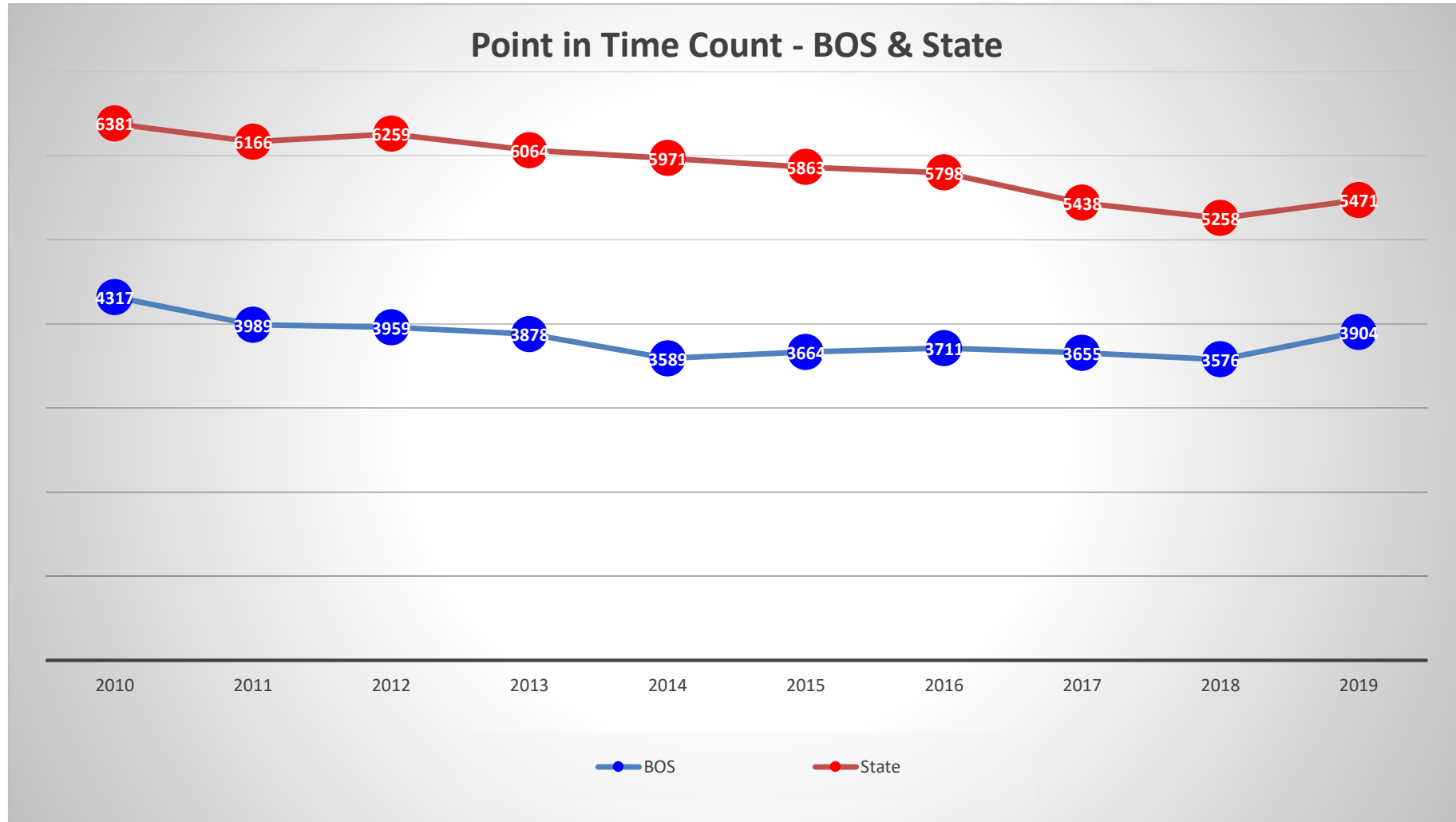

SUMMARY OF RESULTS

- Total PIT BOS increased by 9%
 - Total State increased by 4%
- BOS Highlights
 - Increase in chronic homelessness by 6%
 - Increase in veteran homelessness by 16%
 - Increase in families experiencing homelessness by 16%
- Regional Highlights
 - 5 regions decreased; 12 increased

THE WHY BEHIND THE INCREASE

What worked?

- Improved connection to regions
- Improved work in local regions
- More training for volunteers and more engaged volunteers

Other thoughts:

- There are some large cities not completing unsheltered count. Entitlement cities should be completing an unsheltered/street count.
- Shelter participation: Some shelters did not participate, resulting in data not being truly reflective of our states homeless population.
- Changes in city populations/Increases by region

Future work:

- PIT as outreach & additional homeless data/report
- Additional analysis of data
- Define success

WHAT WAS NOT COUNTED?

- Individuals living in doubled-up situations (with family or friends) or precariously housed, on the edge of becoming homeless. We still received surveys that stated: “living with” – “getting ready to be kicked out” “Living on couch”.
- No PIT Counts: There were **ES and TH** projects that did NOT provide or had no persons in their shelter/TH on the PIT date. If the programs go 2 years in a row without a count, we took them off the HIC Chart temporarily.
- Duplicates/incomplete surveys

COMMUNICATING RESULTS
