## About the *Mobile Opioid Response Team*

The Mobile Opioid Response Team connects with people with Opioid Use Disorder to encourage and facilitate treatment. Our team serves St. Joseph, Elkhart and Marshall counties and will even come to you to help get started!

Our team is made up of mental health professionals and peer coaches who help clients get quick access to services. We have partnerships with health care providers and community partners who address a wide variety of needs.

## *Who can call* the team?

Agencies, prospective clients and friends and family are welcome to call our team. Our staff will ask a few questions to determine whether we can provide the requested help and next steps.

## How much do *services cost*?

Thanks to funding from the Indiana Department of Family & Social Services Administration, the services provided by the Mobile Opioid Response Team are free. Many of the services provided by our partners are also available at no charge to clients.

## *What services* are available?

### **Peer recovery coaching**

Peer coaches offer invaluable support during the early days of recovery and throughout treatment. They connect clients to counseling, medication-assisted treatment (MAT), safe housing, health insurance navigators and even provide transportation to services.

### **Medication-assisted treatment (MAT)**

MAT combines prescription medication with traditional counseling, which is proven to be the most effective treatment for opioid use disorder. Our team connects you to physicians who will help you determine and access the right medication for you.

### **Mental health counseling**

Our team includes licensed social workers and mental health counselors who can provide an initial assessment and connect you to individual, family and group therapy.

### **Additional services**

Our team distributes free naloxone, the opioid overdose-reversal medication, as well as wound care kits. Testing for STDs/HIV and other clinical care is available, as well as access to health educators and community resources that support recovery and harm reduction.
